

Importing Personal Property Into Peru

IMPORTING HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND PERSONAL EFFECTS

DUTY-FREE ENTRY IS PERMITTED IF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET:

- Shipper is a diplomat. Requires Free Entry Permit issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- Shipper is a returning Peruvian National.
 - Must have been living abroad for at least 12 months (and made no return visits during that time).
- Used books and clothing are always duty free

Note:

- Shipper will be charged an average of 20% (import duty) of the estimated value for used household goods. Exact amount is determined by the Peruvian Customs Authority and is generally lower than actual value of items.
- All works of art and antiques are subject to full duties and taxes, even if they are part of a household goods and personal effects shipment.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- ✓ 2 Original Air Waybills or Bills of Lading
- ✓ Packing list
- ✓ Original Passport
- ✓ Proof of Residence in Peru (i.e. Residence Card)
- ✓ Legalized copy of Labor Contract duly presented to the Peruvian Ministry of Labor

IMPORTING AUTOMOBILES:

- Must not be older than five years
- Must be inspected at origin prior to shipment.
- Emissions must not exceed 9% Carbon

(cont.)

- Inspection Certificate must be requested by shipper before automobile arrives. No vehicle will be accepted for import without it
- Automobiles with an accident history that includes overturns or obvious damage will be accepted.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- Original Commercial Invoice
- Original Ocean Bill of Lading with the following information:
 - Correct and complete motor and chassis numbers
 - Year
 - Color
 - Net Weight
 - Vehicle model name

Note:

Requirements are the same for motorcycles, jetskis and boats.

IMPORTING PETS:

- There are currently no restrictions on the importation of pets into Peru.
- All animals will be subject to a medical exam upon arrival
- Shipper must provide an official Health Certificate and Vaccine Record issued at origin.
- Documents must be signed and stamped by the Ministry of Agriculture in the country of origin. It is highly recommended that the Peruvian consulate at origin also stamp these documents.

RESTRICTED/PROHIBITED ITEMS:

- Pornography
- Firearms
- Prescriptions must accompany all medications
- Special Telecommunications Equipment

IMPORTING FIREARMS:

- To avoid delays, do not pack any firearms in the Household Goods shipment.
- Shipper must present the original purchase invoice and an unexpired shooting license for all firearms,
- Arms, ammunition, and dangerous objects must receive authorization issued by the Ministry of the Interior.
